These programs are annually reaching over 15,000 Pinellas County children, giving young people the opportunity to experience the value of being part of something larger than themselves while developing the foundational skills and values that will guide them through the next phases of their lives. CFY Pinellas utilizes attendance at a Pinellas County Schools Title 1 elementary or middle school as a key indicator of need, helping ensure that cost, access, and safe equipment are never financial barriers to participation.
