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Activities include designing, constructing, and upgrading aviation training facilities, classrooms, and hangar space at Tallahassee International Airport (TLH). Services will include advanced technical instruction, certification programs, and hands-on workforce training to prepare students and professionals for careers in Advanced Air Mobility (AAM) and eVTOL technologies.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide citizens with expanded access to aviation education and workforce training programs, creating high-skill, high-wage career opportunities in Advanced Air Mobility (AAM) and related aviation fields.
