13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds requested are intended to expand implementation of the classical education model by supporting professional development, specialized teacher compensation, supplemental technology, instructional materials, and promotional efforts. The program will serve up to 250 students, enhancing educational opportunities and expanding school choice within the district.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The appropriation project directly benefits students by offering an additional choice in learning opportunities within Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Thus, M-DCPS would afford families with a school-wide choice option. It facilitates the transformation of a traditional public school into a classical education school, marking the first school-wide choice program of its kind.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Parents and students will have access to an alternative educational model, which in turn will expand school choice options. Students enrolled in the Classical Education school will receive a comprehensive education that includes courses in literature, grammar, reading, math, foreign language, science, social studies, art, and music.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project aims to serve and support up to 250 students within Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is to provide students with a comprehensive classical education curriculum that fosters critical thinking, cultural literacy, and interdisciplinary learning, ultimately enhancing their academic success and preparation for real-world applications. The outcome will be measured through student assessments like the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST), monitoring proficiency in key subjects, and tracking enrollment and application interest to gauge program effectiveness.
