Requested funds will replace and upgrade approx. 2.25 miles of undersized water mains to 8in and 12in diameter, ensuring improved water quality for customers. Leak detection will identify aging mains for replacement, completing the replacement of the most urgent segments in Council District 3. These upgrades will enhance water conservation, reduce water loss, improve fire flow and protection, and ensure compliance with Florida's Lead & Copper Rule Revision, and provide efficient water flow.
