### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

State funding would help revegetate Captiva's storm-damaged dunes with diverse native plants. After Hurricanes Ian, Helene, and Milton, this vegetation is essential to stabilize sand, strengthen dune structure, speed recovery, and provide important wildlife habitat while improving long-term coastal resilience. It will also support replacement of invasive plants that were part of a strategic island wide removal.

The project will restore native dune habitat and replace invasive vegetation across approximately 24,000 linear feet of shoreline, increasing vegetative cover by at least 50%. This enhanced plant diversity will improve dune stability, reduce erosion, and create foraging and nesting habitat for shorebirds, pollinators, and other wildlife, resulting in a measurable increase in wildlife use and ecosystem function.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Revegetation stabilizes the dunes, helping them absorb storm surge and wave energy. This reduces erosion and lowers the risk of flooding and overwash, providing natural protection that helps keep the public, homes, and infrastructure more safe during hurricanes and severe weather.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The residents and visitors of the island of Captiva are the target population. The island currently has over 300 full time residents and receives tens of thousands of visitors annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will revegetate roughly 24,000 linear feet of shoreline, increasing vegetative cover by at least 50% and enhancing habitat for shorebirds, pollinators, and other wildlife. Benefits will be measured through vegetation monitoring, dune-elevation surveys, and wildlife observations to document ecological improvements and track dune stability over time
