SeaPort Manatee is a catalyst for state and regional growth. Population and industry growth is forecasted to increase demand for key SeaPort imports ranging from fruit to household appliances. To that end, the request of General Revenue Funds is to complete a 10-acre expansion (Part 1 of 3) of Seaport's container yard. This increases capacity by 45,000 TEUs toward a 135,000 TEU goal, enabling the port to handle more containerized cargo and meet the growing demand in Southwest Florida.
