13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this project is to enhance safety along the Dolan Road corridor, a 2-lane minor urban arterial (local residential road), that serves as a east-west collector for thru-traffic, and the connector for residents walking/biking to school or Village parks. The improvements will upgrade the sidewalk with a multi-use path for safety and better ADA compliance, and provide intersection improvements to slow traffic and enhance driver visibility of pedestrians/bicyclists.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

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Four (4) vehicle-pedestrian and two (2) vehicle-bicycle crashes have reported since 2017 on this roadway. The proposed improvements will provide a safe pathway for the students on their way to school (G-Star School of the Arts) and residents walking/biking to the Village's parks, ballfields and library. The proposed safety improvements are recommended by the Village's Vision Zero Action Plan to reduce vehicular conflicts to 0.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed roadway safety improvements will enhance the safety of pedestrians/bicyclists traveling along the corridor with a separated mutli-use path. Dolan Road does not currently have sidewalks on both sides of the street. There is documented speeding (10-19 mph beyond the speed limit). The proposed safety and "traffic calming" intersection improvements will reduce vehicular speeds and bring better visibility of pedestrians/bicyclists at enhanced crosswalks. The goals is to eliminate crashes involving pedestrians/bicyclists.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

A specific population is not able to be measured because drivers use Dolan Road as an alternate to Forest Hill Boulevard (SR882), and drive at speeds of the major arterial. The vehicular speeds range from 35-44 in the 85 percentile, but the road is posted for 25 mph. The average daily traffic volume is 5000 trips. This is expected to increase as overall volumes in the region increase. G-Star School of the Arts, a charter high school located nearby on Congress Avenue has 693 students. Resident students can be seen walking, biking and e-scootering to school along the Dolan Road sidewalk. The proposed improvements will provide a safer route to school for students who live in the immediate area.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The improvements will provide a safe route for residents who are walking or biking to the park, library and special events. (The Village Municipal Complex with ballfields, tennis/pickleball courts, basketball courts, splash pad water park, playground and library is located on this segment of Dolan Road.) The proposed safety improvements are recommended by the Village's Vision Zero Action Plan to reduce vehicular conflicts to 0. Crash reports will be monitored to evaluate success of this effort.
