13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funds will upgrade the 6th Avenue and Main Street roundabout by adding lanes to improve traffic flow, reduce congestion, and enhance safety. Both Main Street and 6th Avenue are operating more than 75% over their designed capacity, causing daily backups and delays. Upgrades include new pavement markings, signage, lighting, and pedestrian crossings, along with drainage improvements to support stormwater management. These enhancements will increase efficiency, accommodate growing traffic demands, and ensure safer access for motorists and pedestrians in the Town of Windermere.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project will include roadway expansion, resurfacing, and lane additions to improve traffic flow. Activities include installing new pavement markings, upgraded signage, enhanced lighting, and pedestrian crossings for safety. Drainage improvements will support stormwater management. Engineering, design, and construction services will ensure efficient implementation. These upgrades will enhance traffic capacity, reduce congestion, and improve overall safety at the 6th Avenue and Main Street roundabout in Windermere.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation project will provide citizens with improved traffic flow, reduced congestion, and enhanced safety at the 6th Avenue and Main Street roundabout. Upgraded signage, lighting, and pavement markings will improve navigation and visibility. Pedestrian crossings will ensure safer access for all users. Additionally, drainage improvements will enhance stormwater management, reducing flooding risks. These upgrades will create a safer, more efficient roadway for residents and visitors.

The target population includes Windermere residents, commuters, local businesses, and visitors who travel through the 6th Avenue and Main Street roundabout. This intersection serves as a key access point in the town's roadway network.
