a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will create an advanced, scalable and effective AI-based monitoring tool for law enforcement to combat the demand for human trafficking activity by monitoring and analyzing buyers' on-line search behaviors. Additionally, the Center will establish a Joint Law Enforcement Training Program to provide ongoing training opportunities for law enforcement in newly developed technology and detection tools.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The outcome objectives for this initiative include (1) developing a monitoring tool, (2) providing actionable intelligence to law enforcement and NGOs, (3) raising awareness and educating among potential buyers to mitigate and stop before it happens, and (4) ensuring the tool can be adapted for use across different disciplines and on-line platforms.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Same as (a) above: (1) developing a monitoring tool, (2) providing actionable intelligence to law enforcement and NGOs, (3) raising awareness and educating among potential buyers to mitigate and stop before it happens, and (4) ensuring the tool can be adapted for use across different disciplines and on-line platforms.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At-risk youth, crime victims, vulnerable women and children, and tools and training for state and local law enforcement.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Combating human trafficking activities; developing and implementing an advanced Al-driven solution for Law enforcement; providing actionable intelligence to help identify and prosecute buyers and support victims; educating potential buyers to mitigate and stop the purchase before it happens and promoting safe on-line behaviors. Measurements: reduction in victims and arrests; increased protection for women and girls (78% of victims).
