Parkwood Street to stormwater improvexpansion of impe 1437423, because to swing around ar to the SR 50 sidew local foundation (L	The Gadson Street Sidewalk & Trail project will add a new sidewalk/trail and lighting along Gadson Street from Parkwood Street to SR 50, supporting safer and healthier transportation options. The project incorporates important stormwater improvements, including a drainage swale on the west side of Gadson Street, which is necessary due to the expansion of impervious area within the FDOT right-of-way. The trail is routed along the east side, using parcel AltKey: 1437423, because constraints like utilities and city design standards limit placement options. The alignment is designed to swing around an existing utility pole and comply with buffer and width requirements, providing the needed connection to the SR 50 sidewalk while integrating adequate stormwater management measures The project is partially funded by a local foundation (Live Well Foundation of South Lake), benefits very-low, low- to moderate-income residents, and targets completion by September 30, 2026.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The specific purpose and goals to be achieved by the requested state funds are to construct critical infrastructure improvements along Gadson Street Trail. These funds will enable the installation of ADA-compliant sidewalks and walkways, enhanced stormwater management systems, and roadway upgrades. The project aims to improve pedestrian safety, increase accessibility, reduce flooding, and protect water quality in Lake David. Ultimately, the funds will support community revitalization, environmental resilience, and equitable access to public spaces for low- to moderate-income residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of ADA-compliant walkways, installation of advanced stormwater management systems (such as bioretention areas, swales, and drainage structures), roadway reconstruction. These activities will improve pedestrian safety, accessibility, flood mitigation, and water quality, directly supporting community revitalization and environmental resilience within the project area. All work will be performed in compliance with state and federal grant requirements and will benefit low- to moderate-income residents.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation project will provide direct services to citizens by constructing new ADA-compliant walkways for safer, more accessible pedestrian routes; improving stormwater management to reduce flooding and enhance water quality; upgrading roadways for better traffic flow and safety; and stabilizing the shoreline with native vegetation to protect the local environment. These improvements will increase walkability, public safety, and environmental resilience, directly benefiting residents, especially those in low- to moderate-income areas, by making public spaces safer, more accessible, and more enjoyable.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is the residents of the City of Groveland, specifically those living in the Gadson Street corridor. The project service area is comprised of greater than 51% low- to moderate-income individuals, ensuring the project primarily benefits these groups. The City of Groveland has a population of 18,505 (2020 Census), and while the exact number of individuals directly served will depend on the final project boundaries, the improvements are designed to benefit all residents and visitors who use these public spaces, with a particular focus on increasing accessibility and safety for low- to moderate-income households.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project is expected to deliver safer, more accessible pedestrian routes, improved stormwater management to reduce flooding and enhance water quality and upgraded roadways. These outcomes will increase walkability, public safety, environmental resilience, and overall quality of life for residents, especially those in low- to moderate-income areas. Outcomes will be measured by tracking the completion of ADA-compliant sidewalks and walkways, the installation and performance of stormwater systems, and the reduction in localized flooding incidents. Additional metrics may include pre- and post-project pedestrian counts, resident satisfaction surveys, water quality testing in Lake David, and documentation of improved accessibility and safety within the project area. Compliance with grant deliverables and reporting requirements will also serve as key measures of success.
