a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Enhance on-going efforts to keep our students, teachers and staff safe and in a monitored environment, coupled with the recent fatal shootings in Christian schools, we are looking to upgrade our security systems with new cutting-edge technology, electronic door access controls, video monitoring systems with AI security cameras that include fire and explosive detections, weapon detection, facial screenings, etc. for 3 campuses for over 1,450 children from ages PK3 (3 years old) to 18 (12th Grade).

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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These security enhancements will serve to keep safe and protect the thousands of students, families, church members, community members and businesses who visit and utilize our school campuses year-round, seven days a week.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Safer facilities for our students from the ages of 3 years old (PK3) - 18 (12th Grade) along with their families, community members and elderly grandparents who visit them year-round to mitigate harm to individuals from random school shootings or suspicious persons on site etc.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 100,000 annually visiting our campuses. Preschool students, Grade school students, High School students, Elderly persons (visiting the campuses), and Businesses

Improve mental health: Provide students and parents with peace and stability that their children are in the safest environment with these enhanced security measures.
