13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The funds requested will be used to establish the Aventura Public Safety Intelligence Center (APSIC) and deploy Drone First Responder (DFR) units to enhance public safety, improve officer effectiveness, and strengthen community trust through advanced technology. The APSIC will centralize real-time data and intelligence, giving officers immediate, actionable information that improves response times, decision-making, and resource allocation. Three DFR units will expand capabilities by providing rapid aerial situational awareness, allowing officers to arrive better informed, reduce risks to the public and officers, and increase efficiency in handling critical incidents. These initiatives are especially valuable in protecting high-profile community institutions, including synagogues and Jewish community centers, which are vital to the city's cultural and religious life. These technologies will serve as a force multiplier, enabling proactive crime prevention, & stronger emergency response.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Aventura Police Department will establish a fully equipped Aventura Public Safety Intelligence Center (APSIC) that will centralize data and intelligence from citywide cameras, license plate readers, and other technology platforms to provide officers with real-time situational awareness. The APSIC will deliver continuous monitoring, analytical support, and intelligence-led deployment to enhance crime prevention and investigative efforts, including protection of synagogues and Jewish community centers. In addition, the funds will provide for the purchase and deployment of three Drone First Responder (DFR) units, which will deliver rapid aerial response, live-streamed video to responding officers, and critical over-watch during emergencies or high-risk incidents. Together, these services will improve response times, increase officer and community safety, optimize resource allocation, and expand the department's ability to protect all residents and visitors.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation will provide direct services that enhance the safety, security, and quality of life for Aventura's religious facilities, residents, businesses, and visitors. Through the Aventura Public Safety Intelligence Center (APSIC), citizens will benefit from faster police response times, improved crime deterrence through expanded citywide camera coverage, and more efficient allocation of resources to areas of greatest need. The integration of three DFR units will deliver rapid aerial support to critical incidents, allowing officers to arrive better informed and reducing risks to both the public and first responders. These technologies will directly serve citizens by increasing community safety, improving emergency response capabilities, enhancing traffic and event management, and safeguarding vital institutions such as synagogues and Jewish community centers, including the pedestrian traffic to and from them, while providing greater transparency and accountability in policing.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project includes the approximately 40,000 residents of the City of Aventura, along with more than 30 million annual visitors who come to the community for its shopping, entertainment, cultural attractions, and the concentrated, vibrant faith-based institutions such as synagogues and Jewish community centers. The Aventura Public Safety Intelligence Center (APSIC) and Drone First Responder (DFR) program will directly serve these populations by enhancing safety, improving emergency response, and ensuring a secure environment for residents, businesses, and visitors alike. The project will also play a critical role in safeguarding Jewish citizens walking to and from synagogue, particularly during high-attendance services and religious observances. In total, the project is expected to positively impact over 30 million individuals each year while providing continuous protection and support for the city's permanent population.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is a safer, more secure community through the deployment of the Aventura Public Safety Intelligence Center (APSIC) and DFR program, which will enhance crime prevention, accelerate emergency response, and improve overall public safety. Key benefits include faster response times, increased situational awareness for officers, expanded citywide surveillance coverage, improved traffic and event management, and a measurable reduction in crime and community risk. Outcomes will be evaluated using response time data, the number of incidents where APSIC and drone intelligence directly supported resolution, crime statistics, and citizen satisfaction surveys. Additional performance metrics will include drone deployments, investigative cases supported, and real-time monitoring hours logged, ensuring accountability and demonstrating tangible impact for residents and the more than 30 million visitors who rely on Aventura for safety and security.
