a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The TASKFORCE brings together local, county, state, and federal partners in a coordinated effort to combat child exploitation and human trafficking. These public/private resources will facilitate the investigation, charging, prosecution, and prevention of criminal activities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding supports the establishment and maintenance of a laboratory facility, acquisition of investigative technology, and salary reimbursement to participating agencies for assigned law enforcement task force personnel. These public/private resources will facilitate the investigation, charging, prosecution, and prevention of criminal activities related to child exploitation and human trafficking.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

These funds directly support local law enforcement in their public safety mission to combat child exploitation and human trafficking within the community.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funds used to support law enforcement's efforts will benefit every citizen in Southwest Florida, particularly those residing in counties with INTERCEPT task force representation. Citizens will benefit from the more efficient use of law enforcement resources and safer communities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This funding will increase law enforcement's ability to investigate and prosecute child sexual exploitation and human trafficking cases. As a result of more efficient resources, law enforcement will be able to rescue more children and human trafficking survivors. In addition to the INTERCEPT task force data, each county keeps data on every investigation, arrest, indictment, and prosecution.
