Subsection (15) is added to section 16 17 409.175, Florida Statutes, to read: 409.175 Licensure of family foster homes, residential 18 19 child-caring agencies, and child-placing agencies. --20 (15) The following information contained in the 21 licensing file is exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) 22 and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution unless otherwise ordered by the court: the home, business, work, 23 childcare, or school addresses, floor plan of the home, 24 25 telephone numbers, social security numbers, birthdates, 26 identifying information in neighbor references, and 27 photographs of persons who are licensed under this section to 28 be family foster parents and of their spouses, their minor 29 children, and other adult household members, as well as 30 identifying information in similar sensitive, personal information that is provided to the department by the foster

1 parents, their spouses, their children, or other household members. This provision applies to all individuals who were 2 3 foster parents and became adoptive parents. This subsection shall stand repealed October 2, 2003, unless reviewed and 4 5 saved from repeal by the Legislature. 6 Section 2. The Legislature finds that exempting from 7 public records requirements personal information concerning persons who are licensed under section 409.175, Florida 8 9 Statutes, to be family foster parents and their spouses, 10 children, and other adult household members would reduce the risk that other individuals including parents or relatives 11 could threaten, harass, or cause physical harm or other injury 12 to foster children or their foster families. The Legislature 13 14 finds that the availability to the public of personal and sensitive background information lessens the willingness of 15 prospective caregivers to reveal sensitive information that is 16 17 necessary in assessing the abilities of foster parents and making appropriate placements for children. The Legislature 18 19 further finds that the availability to the public of such information has a negative effect on the recruitment and 20 retention of foster parents. 21 22 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 23 law. 24 25 26 SENATE SUMMARY 27 Provides an exemption from public records requirements for personal information concerning persons who are licensed under s. 409.175, F.S., to be family foster parents and their spouses, children, and other adult household members. 28 29 30 31
