SENATE SUMMARY Provides that any person licensed under chapter 561, F.S., (the Beverage Law) who knowingly sells, gives, furnishes, or otherwise provides alcoholic beverages to a person who is visibly intoxicated shall be liable for person who is visibly intoxicated shall be liable for injury or damages caused by or resulting from the intoxication of such person. Provides that any person licensed under chapter 561, F.S., who knowingly sells, gives, furnishes, or otherwise provides alcoholic beverages to a person who, through reasonable procedures, should have been known to be not of lawful drinking age or to a person habitually addicted to the excessive use of alcoholic beverages may be liable for injury or damage caused by or resulting from the intoxication of such person.
