13	maximum fee that such attorney may receive is \$250,000.
14	(2) Attorney's fees paid by tobacco companies over and
15	above \$3 million, the maximum allowed under subsection (1),
16	must instead be paid into the General Revenue Fund of the
17	state and earmarked for annual classroom teacher salary
18	bonuses.
19	(3) It is the intent of the Legislature that the \$2.8
20	billion attorney's fees in the tobacco lawsuit be reduced to a
21	maximum of \$3 million with the remaining balance of \$2.797
22	billion to be awarded on an equal basis to classroom teachers
23	of the state as an annual salary bonus.
24	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
25	law.

29	Limits attorney's fees in the state's lawsuit against
