1 House Memorial A memorial to the Congress of the United 2 3 States, urging Congress to enact amendments to 4 the National Voter Registration Act of 1993. 5 6 WHEREAS, the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, 7 while very successful in registering new voters, has opened 8 the elections process to certain abuses that threaten its 9 integrity, and 10 WHEREAS, because the act does not require that a person registering to vote provide some form of identification or 11 12 have his or her signature attested to by an appropriate 13 witness, widespread voter registration fraud is not only 14 possible but probable and prosecution of fraudulent 15 registrants virtually impossible, especially since a person may register by mail and vote absentee without ever having 16 17 been seen by another person, and 18 WHEREAS, because the act also does not require that a 19 person registering to vote provide his or her social security 20 number, it is very difficult to identify registrations that 21 are duplicates or potentially fraudulent, and WHEREAS, it is imperative that the integrity of the 22 23 elections process in this country be preserved, not only for our nation but also for other nations around the world that 24 25 look to our elections process as the example to be followed, 26 NOW, THEREFORE, 27 28 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 29 30

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That the Congress of the United States is requested to amend the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 to require that:

- 1. Every person registering to vote provide appropriate identification or, in the case of a mail-in form, provide either a notarized application photograph of himself or herself for identification purposes or a notarized copy of any authorized form of identification otherwise required to register.
- 2. All voter registration applications be witnessed by the person who is registering the applicant or, in the case of a mail-in form, by any other registered voter of the applicable state or other appropriate witness.
- 3. All newly registering voters list their social security numbers on their applications, with proviso that such numbers will remain confidential and exempt from access by the public and will be used by elections officials only to better maintain the voter rolls.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
