A. Basic Information

1. Claimant:	Triesa Wells		
2. Respondent:	City of Pembroke Pines		
3. Amount Requested:	\$499,000		
4. Type of Claim:	EQUITABLE CLAIM/SETTLEMENT		
5. Respondent's Posture:	The City of Pembroke Pines has agreed to the settlement.		
6. Collateral Sources:	\$20,000 (less fees and costs) from claimant's uninsured motorist carrier \$10,000 bodily injury policy limits (less fees and costs) from owner of 3rd car's insurance carrier.		
7. Prior Legislative History:	None, however the 1996 Legislature enacted CS/HB 863, a claim bill to compensate Randy Warren, one of the injured passengers in Mrs. Wells' vehicle. The \$200,000 statutory limit was paid in connection to that claim.		

B. Procedural Summary: During the pre-trial stages of a civil action filed by Triesa Wells and her husband against the City of Pembroke Pines, the City agreed to settle this case for the total amount of \$499,000. The City had already paid its statutory \$200,000 obligation pursuant to a previous claim brought as a result of the same accident HB 3025 would direct the City to pay the settlement amount of \$499,000.

C. Facts of the Case: In December of 1993, Mrs. Wells, a mother of three young children, was severely injured when her car was struck by a Pembroke Pines Police vehicle at an intersection in which Mrs. Wells had a green light and the police vehicle had a red light. Mrs. Wells suffered a coma, major orthopedic surgery, permanent brain damage, shattered teeth, and permanent scarring and disfigurement. Her medical bills are in excess of \$180,000 and she cannot return to work.
