(b) In order to encourage and facilitate the rigorous prosecution of sexual offenses against children, it is the intent of the Legislature that state attorneys and state and local law enforcement agencies, in conjunction with the courts, shall enforce the provisions of this act to the full extent of the law and do all things appropriate to the effectuation of its purpose and intent which may be within their respective jurisdictions. (3) MANDATORY MINIMUM IMPRISONMENT. -- A person who commits any sexual battery in violation of s. 794.011 upon a child under 13 years of age shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum of 2 years' imprisonment. Notwithstanding s. 921.0012, relating to the sentencing guidelines offense levels, or any other provision of law to the contrary, for purposes of construing or interpreting this subsection, the provisions for mandatory minimum imprisonment in this subsection shall supersede any provision of law the application of which would result in the imposition of a shorter term of imprisonment upon the person sentenced for the offense.
