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yet to be tapped, and 1 2 WHEREAS, the Southwest Water Management District, in 3 cooperation with several state, regional, and local entities, 4 has developed proposals to restore Lake Panasoffkee, NOW, THEREFORE, 5 б 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 8 9 Section 1. Lake Panasoffkee Restoration Council--There 10 is created within the Southwest Florida Water Management 11 District the Lake Panasoffkee Restoration Council. 12 (1)(a) The council shall consist of seven voting 13 members: two representatives of lakefront property owners, one environmental engineer, one person with training in biology or 14 15 another scientific discipline, one person with training as an attorney, one person with training as an engineer, and one 16 17 representative of the sport fishing industry, all to be appointed by the Sumter County Commission. No person serving 18 19 on the council may be appointed to any of the council advisory group agencies' councils, board, or commission. The council 20 members shall serve as advisors to the governing board of the 21 22 Southwest Florida Water Management District. The council is 23 subject to the provisions of chapter 119 and chapter 120, 24 Florida Statutes. 25 The council advisory group to the council shall (b) consist of: one representative each from the Southwest Florida 26 27 Water Management District, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the Florida Department of 28 29 Transportation, the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish 30 Commission, the Withlacoochee River Basin Board, and the 31 United States Army Corps of Engineers, to be appointed by 2 04/08/98

their respective agencies, all of whom must have training in 1 2 biology or another scientific discipline. 3 Immediately after their appointment, the council (2) 4 shall meet and organize by electing a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary, whose terms shall be for 2 years each. Council 5 officers shall not serve consecutive terms. Each council 6 7 member shall be a voting member. 8 (3) The council shall meet at the call of its chair, at the request of six of its members, or at the request of the 9 10 chair of the governing board of the Southwest Florida Water 11 Management District. 12 The council shall have the powers and duties to: (4) 13 (a) Review audits and all data specifically related to 14 lake restoration techniques and sport fish population recovery 15 strategies, including data and strategies for shoreline restoration, sediment control and removal, exotic species 16 management, floating tussock management or removal, 17 18 navigation, water quality, and fisheries habitat improvement, 19 particularly as they may apply to Lake Panasoffkee. Evaluate whether additional studies are needed. 20 (b) Explore all possible sources of funding to conduct 21 (C) 22 the restoration activities. Advise the governing board of the Southwest 23 (d) 24 Florida Water management District regarding the best approach to restoring Lake Panasoffkee, and make a recommendation as to 25 which techniques should be part of the restoration program. 26 27 The governing board of the Southwest Florida Water Management District shall respond in writing to the council if any 28 29 recommendations from the council require re-evaluation. The 30 response shall detail reasons for re-evaluation. 31 (e) Report to the Legislature before November 25 of 3

each year on the progress of the Lake Panasoffkee restoration 1 2 plan and any recommendations for the next fiscal year. 3 The Southwest Florida Water Management District (5) 4 shall provide staff to assist the council in carrying out the 5 provisions of this act. (6) Members of the council shall receive no 6 7 compensation for their services, but are entitled to be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses incurred during 8 execution of their official duties, as provided in section 9 10 112.061, Florida Statutes. State and federal agencies shall be 11 responsible for the per diem and travel expenses of their 12 respective appointees to the council and the Southwest Florida 13 Water Management District shall be responsible for per diem and travel expenses of other appointees to the council. 14 15 Section 2. Lake Panasoffkee restoration program. --(1) The Southwest Florida Water Management District, 16 17 in conjunction with the Department of Environmental 18 Protection, the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, the Sumter County Commission, and the Lake Panasoffkee 19 Restoration Council, shall review existing restoration 20 proposals to determine which ones are the most environmentally 21 sound and economically feasible methods of improving the 22 fisheries and natural systems of Lake Panasoffkee. 23 24 The Southwest Florida Water Management District, (2) 25 in consultation and by agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, the Game and Fresh Water Fish 26 27 Commission, and pertinent local governments, shall develop tasks to be undertaken by those entities necessary to initiate 28 29 the Lake Panasoffkee restoration program recommended by the 30 Lake Panasoffkee Restoration Council. These agencies shall: Evaluate different methodologies for removing the 31 (a) 4

extensive tussocks and build up of organic matter along the 1 2 shoreline and of the aquatic vegetation in the lake; and 3 Conduct any additional studies as recommended by (b) 4 the Lake Panasoffkee Restoration Council. 5 (3) Contingent on the Legislature appropriating funds 6 for the Lake Panasoffkee restoration program and in 7 conjunction with financial participation by federal, other 8 state, and local governments, the appropriate agencies shall 9 through competitive bid award contracts to implement the 10 activities of the Lake Panasoffkee restoration program. 11 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated \$50,000 from 12 the General Revenue Fund to the Southwest Florida Water 13 Management District to implement the provisions of this act. 14 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 15 law. 16 17 18 And the title is amended as follows: 19 On page 1, lines 2-17, 20 21 remove from the title of the bill: all of said lines 22 23 and insert in lieu thereof: 24 An act relating to water management; creating the Lake Panasoffkee Restoration Council; 25 providing for its membership, powers, and 26 27 duties; requiring the Southwest Florida Water Management District to provide staff for the 28 council and to award contracts subject to an 29 30 appropriation of funds; providing an effective 31 date.

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
