City may be used for an indefinite period of time. Section 218.26(3), F.S., shall be waived for the 1997-1998 state fiscal years 1997-1998 and 1998-1999 year and the apportionment factors for the municipalities and counties shall be recalculated pursuant to s. 218.245, F.S. Initial population estimates for calculating eligibility for shared revenues shall be determined by the University of Florida Bureau of Economic and Business Research. Should the Bureau be unable to provide an appropriate population estimate, the Collier County Department of Community Development shall provide an appropriate estimate. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. 

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
