II. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

The functions of the former Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services (HRS) are now performed by the Department of Children and Family Services, the Department of Health, the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Department of Juvenile Justice and other departments and agencies. Many sections of Florida Statutes do not reflect these changes and still show HRS as responsible for many functions and activities.

House Bill 4483 directs the Division of Statutory Revision to prepare a reviser's bill that makes necessary technical and conforming changes to sections of Florida Statutes to correctly assign functions and activities to the appropriate department or agency.

A reviser's bill is a nonsubstantive bill passed by the Legislature for the purpose of removing inconsistencies, redundancies, and unnecessary repetitions in the Florida Statutes and for otherwise improving their clarity and facilitating their correct and proper interpretation. The only official reviser's bills are those prepared by the Statutory Revision of the Joint Legislative Management Committee under the authority of s.11.242, Florida Statutes.
