I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 4585 passed the House on April 23, 1998; in the Senate was substituted for SB 2440 and passed on May 1, 1998. Became law without Governor's signature on May 30, 1998. Chapter Law 98-349.

II. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This legislation re-creates the Sale of Goods and Services Trust Fund without modification. The Sale of Goods and Services Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Corrections.

Section 216.262, F.S. provides for revenue source

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The establishment of the Sale of Goods and Services Trust Fund is necessary in order to account for rents and utilities received from Department of Corrections' employees living in state housing. The funds are used to repair and renovate state housing or dormitories.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major source of income comes from the sale of goods and services based on employee prerequisite payments. The total estimate for the 11998-1999 fiscal year is \$1,090,646.
