An act relating to aiding or harboring runaway children; creating s. 787.035, F.S.; defining the offense of knowingly encouraging, aiding, abetting, or conspiring with a child to run away from home, or knowingly harboring a runaway child; providing penalties; defining "harbor" and "home"; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 787.035, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

787.035.--(1) Any person who knowingly encourages, aids, abets, or conspires with a child to run away from home or knowingly harbors a child who has run away from home commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

20 (2) For the purposes of this section:

- (a) "Harbor" means to keep secreted, cohabit with, or provide shelter for any minor without the consent of the parent, legal guardian, legal custodian, Department of Children and Family Services or Department of Juvenile Justice, or other person having legal custody of such minor.
- (b) "Home" means the child's place of residence, including the home of any parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian or a Department of Children and Family Services shelter or foster home, a Department of Juvenile Justice shelter, or a state-approved or court-ordered shelter or crisis intervention facility.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1997, and shall apply to offenses committed on or after that date.
