WHEREAS, Matthew White attended the Georgia Military 1 2 Academy for 2 years, and 3 WHEREAS, following his attendance at Georgia Military 4 Academy, Matthew White received an early commission as a 5 Second Lieutenant in the United States Army, and WHEREAS, the program required him to serve in the troop 6 7 unit during the last 2 years of his college enrollment so that he could enter federal active duty upon graduation, and 8 9 WHEREAS, the accident of November 5, 1988, the injuries 10 sustained by Matthew White as a result of the accident, and the recuperation from those injuries put Matthew White 11 12 seriously behind in his obligation to complete college within 13 that time period, and to receive his Officer's Basic Training, 14 and 15 WHEREAS, Matthew White was medically disabled for a 16 year and a half following the accident, and was finally called 17 to active duty for his Officer's Basic Training Course as a result of Operation Desert Storm, and 18 19 WHEREAS, Matthew White was rejected for active duty following the completion of Operation Desert Storm, and 20 WHEREAS, the ROTC Senior Military Instructor who was 21 22 called as an expert witness in this case stated that Matthew 23 White effectively lost his opportunity to compete as an Engineer Officer in the United States Army in both the active 24 25 component and the reserve component, and 26 WHEREAS, Matthew White is now discharged from the 27 United States Army, and WHEREAS, as a result of the accident of November 5, 28 29 1988, Matthew White sustained serious injury that formed the basis of legal action brought by Matthew White, and 30 31 3 CODING: Words stricken are deletions; words underlined are additions.

WHEREAS, following trial on this matter, a judgment was 1 2 returned by the jury in the amount of \$489,942.65, and 3 WHEREAS, a subsequent award for costs and the amount of 4 the judgment was entered in the amount of \$501,116.19, and 5 WHEREAS, a total of \$55,000 was paid from Florida Risk 6 Management toward the settlement, and \$45,000 had been paid on 7 behalf of the City of Waldo in settlement of the claim prior 8 to the trial in this action, and 9 WHEREAS, the verdict returned by the jury assessed 100 percent liability for the accident upon the Alachua County 10 11 Sheriff's Department, and 12 WHEREAS, there remains due and unpaid the sum of 13 \$401,116.19, NOW, THEREFORE, 14 15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 16 17 Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act are found and declared to be true. 18 19 Section 2. The Alachua County Sheriff's Department is 20 authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the sheriff's department not otherwise appropriated and to draw a 21 warrant in the sum of \$275,000 payable to Matthew White as 22 23 compensation for injuries and damages sustained due to the 24 negligence of the Alachua County Sheriff's Department. 25 Section 3.
