## II. Summary of Amendments Contained in Message

## **House Amendment 1**

This amendment defines the term "medical case manager" for purposes of the managed care workers' compensation law. Under this definition a qualified rehabilitation provider, as defined under the workers' compensation law, or a licensed registered nurse would be deemed to be a medical case manager so long as they act under the supervision of a medical case coordinator. The amendment is an attempt to allow non-medical personnel to become medical case managers for workers' compensation and would lower the standards needed for a case manager by not requiring a medical background or medical experience for *all* medical case managers. This could result in a lesser quality of patient care.
