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A bill to be entitled An act relating to eradication of agricultural pests; prescribing additional duties of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the Department of Health with respect to programs of emergency application of pesticide for eradication of plant pests; requiring studies of pesticides and of health issues relating to their use; requiring development of a system for informing the public of such programs and requiring public and other notice of certain programs of pest eradication; providing for information to be furnished to health-care providers; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. To carry out its duties with respect to

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emergency responses to plant pest infestations when the eradication programs involve aerial pesticide spraying or the application of pesticides to residential property by means other than aerial spraying, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall:

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(1) Study the effect of each pesticide that the department uses. The study must address the effects of the pesticide on human populations, on plant life, on animal life other than human populations, and on the target pest.

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(2) Provide a system for dissemination of information to the public about infestations of pests that are the subject of such eradication programs. The system shall disseminate

information relating to the pest; the pesticide selected to eradicate that pest; the effects of the pesticide on the human 2 3 population and the environment in the area in which an eradication program will be conducted; recommended safety 4 5 precautions; the alternative methods of responding to the pest 6 infestation; and the names, addresses, and telephone numbers 7 of physicians and health care facilities in the area in which 8 the eradication program will be conducted which specialize in health problems resulting from chemical exposure. The 9 department of Health shall assist the Department of 10 11 Agriculture and Consumer Services in carrying out its duties under this subsection. 12 Section 2. At any time when the Department of 13 Agriculture and Consumer Services is conducting an emergency 14 response to a plant pest infestation which involves aerial 15 spraying of pesticide or the application of pesticide to 16 17 residential property by means other than aerial spraying, the Department of Health shall monitor health problems that result 18 19 from chemical exposure about which complaints are made to physicians and health care facilities. The Department of 20 Health shall provide a toll-free hotline on which persons may 21 register complaints and shall make a record of all calls 22 received on that line. With the advice of the Department of 23 Health, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services 24 shall adopt by rule standards for determining when the use of 25 a particular pesticide should be discontinued. 26 27 Section 3. Before the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services begins an emergency response to a plant pest 28 29 infestation which involves aerial spraying of pesticide or the 30 application of pesticide to residential property by means other than aerial spraying, the department shall notify the 31

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public in the area in which the pesticide is to be applied of its impending action. Notice must be given at least 48 hours 2 3 before beginning the eradication program. The department shall use all reasonable methods to disseminate information 4 5 required under this section as widely as possible. Information 6 to be disseminated includes: the information described in 7 section 1(2), a copy of any Environmental Protection Agency 8 permit or other permit under which the pesticide will be applied, and the source, including the author and the date of 9 10 publication, of any technical information about the pesticide 11 which is included in the notice; the area over which the pesticide will be applied; the predicted duration of the 12 application period; and the number of the Department of Health 13 toll-free hotline. When the response is conducted over a 14 period longer than 1 week, the department shall notify the 15 public in the area weekly of the program's continuation. 16 17 department shall notify the public in the area when a response 18 is terminated. 19 Section 4. The Department of Health shall provide 20 physicians and health care facilities in an area in which the 21 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is conducting an emergency response to a plant infestation which involves 22 aerial spraying of pesticide or the application of pesticide 23 24 to residential property by means other than aerial spraying with technical assistance relating to health problems that 25 26 result from chemical exposure. 27 Section 5. The Department of Health shall cooperate 28 with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services when 29 the latter department is carrying out an emergency response to 30 a plant pest infestation which involves aerial spraying of

pesticide or the application of pesticide to residential

property by means other than aerial spraying. The Department of Health shall obtain independent expert opinion on safety 2 3 issues relating to pesticide application and shall contract with an independent chemical expert, who shall provide 4 5 information directly to the public as well as to the 6 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, which shall 7 include that information in the notices it is required to 8 provide. 9 Section 6. The Commissioner of Agriculture shall 10 notify the Governor and the remaining members of the Cabinet 11 that the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services will begin an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which 12 involves aerial spraying of pesticide or the application of 13 14 pesticide to residential property by means other than aerial spraying at the same time the department provides public 15 notice under section 3 and include in that notification the 16 17 same information contained in the public notice. When the 18 response is conducted over a period longer than 1 week, the 19 commissioner shall weekly notify the Governor and the remaining members of the Cabinet of its continuation. 20 21 commissioner shall notify the Governor and the remaining members of the Cabinet when a response is terminated. 22 Section 7. SENATE SUMMARY Provides for the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to furnish notice to the public, to the Governor, and to the Cabinet whenever it is going to commence an emergency response to a plant pest infestation which involves aerial spraying of pesticide or the application of pesticide to residential property by means other than aerial spraying. Prescribes information that must be contained in such notice. Requires the department to study pesticide effects, and to provide a system of information dissemination. Requires the Department of Health to monitor health problems resulting from pesticide application and to provide technical assistance to health-care providers. provide technical assistance to health-care providers.
