An act relating to candidates for public office; amending s. 99.012, F.S.; requiring a subordinate officer, deputy sheriff, or police officer seeking public office to resign or take a leave of absence, depending on certain circumstances relating to the office sought; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 Section 1. Subsection (5) of section 99.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

99.012 Restrictions on individuals qualifying for public office.--

- (5) (a) A person who is a subordinate officer, deputy sheriff, or police officer <u>must</u> need not resign <u>effective upon</u> <u>qualifying</u> pursuant to this <u>chapter if</u> <u>section unless</u> the person is seeking to qualify for a public office <u>that</u> which is currently held by an officer who has authority to appoint, employ, promote, or otherwise supervise that person and who has qualified as a candidate for reelection to that office.
- (b) However, Upon qualifying pursuant to this chapter, a the subordinate officer, deputy sheriff, or police officer who is seeking public office and who is not required to resign under paragraph (a) must take a leave of absence without pay during the period in which he or she is a candidate for office.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
