Section 212.0805, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 13 14 212.0805 Taxpayer relief days.--(1) No tax levied under the provisions of this chapter 15 16 shall be collected on sales of clothing having a taxable value 17 of \$100 or less during the week beginning 12:01 a.m. on the first Saturday in February, and the week beginning 12:01 a.m. 18 19 on the first Saturday in August, of each year. 20 (2) As used in this section, the term "clothing" means 21 any article of wearing apparel, including backpacks and all 22 footwear, intended to be worn on or about the human body. For purposes of this section, the term "clothing" does not include 23 watches, watchbands, jewelry, umbrellas, or belt buckles. 24 25 (3) This section does not apply to sales within a 26 theme park or entertainment complex as defined in s. 27 509.013(9), or within a public lodging establishment as 28 defined in s. 509.013(4). 29 (4) The provisions of chapter 120 to the contrary 30 notwithstanding, the Department of Revenue may adopt rules to carry out this section. 31 1

Section 2. The sum of \$200,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Revenue for the 1999-2000 fiscal year for the purpose of administering this act. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a б law. SENATE SUMMARY Exempts sales of articles of clothing having a taxable value of \$100 or less from taxes imposed under ch. 212, F.S., for a 1-week period beginning the first Saturday in February and a 1-week period beginning the first Saturday in August of each year.
