I. Summary:

This bill provides the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) must allocate no less than 1 percent of the cost of a project specifically for roadside beautification on that project.

This bill substantially amends section 334.044 of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Section 334.044, F.S., provides the powers and duties of the FDOT. The section requires the FDOT to provide for the conservation of natural roadside growth and scenery, and for the implementation and maintenance of roadside beautification programs.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 334.044, F.S., is amended to provide the FDOT must allocate no less than 1 percent of the cost of a project specifically for roadside beautification on that project.

VIII. Amendments:

1 by Transportation:

The amendment provides that the FDOT must annually spend for roadside beautification an amount equal to no less than one percent of the amount contracted for construction.
