25-921-99 1 Senate Memorial No. ____ 2 A memorial to the Congress of the United 3 States, urging the Congress to act on an 4 amendment to the Constitution of the United 5 States relating to the rights of crime victims. 6 7 WHEREAS, in 1988, an overwhelming majority of the citizens of the State of Florida voted to amend the 8 9 Constitution of the State of Florida to provide that victims of crime or their lawful representatives, including the next 10 of kin of homicide victims, are entitled to the right to be 11 12 informed of and to be present and to be heard when relevant at all crucial stages of criminal proceedings to the extent that 13 these rights do not interfere with the constitutional rights 14 15 of the accused, and WHEREAS, in 1982, the President's Task Force on Victims 16 17 of Crime recommended an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to victims' rights, and 18 19 WHEREAS, at least 28 of the states have now passed 20 amendments to their respective state constitutions in regard 21 to the rights of crime victims, and 22 WHEREAS, an amendment to the Constitution of the United 23 States establishing and protecting the rights of crime victims 24 is an essential step in our efforts to balance the scales of 25 justice, and WHEREAS, under Article V of the Constitution of the 26 27 United States, amendments to the Constitution of the United 28 States may be proposed by the Congress or, upon the application of the legislatures of two-thirds of the states, 29 30 the Congress shall call a constitutional convention for the 31 purpose of proposing amendments, and 1 CODING: Words stricken are deletions; words underlined are additions. **Florida Senate - 1999** 25-921-99 (NP) SM 1492

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
