These services must be available 24 hours 29 30 a day, 7 days a week, and must include: 31 (1) CORE SERVICES.--

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1 (a) The hospice care team shall directly provide the 2 following core services: physician services, nursing services, 3 social work services, pastoral or counseling services, dietary 4 counseling, home health aide services, and bereavement 5 counseling services. Physician services may be provided by the 6 hospice directly or through contract. A hospice may also use 7 contracted staff if necessary to supplement hospice employees in order to meet the needs of patients during periods of peak 8 patient loads or under extraordinary circumstances. 9 10 (b) Each hospice must also provide or arrange for such additional services as are needed to meet the palliative and 11 12 support needs of the patient and family.
