Legislative findings and intent.--19 (1) The Legislature finds that: 20 (a) Each year, more than half of all pregnancies in 21 this state are unintended. 22 (b) Contraceptive services are part of basic health 23 care, allowing families to both adequately space desired 24 pregnancies and avoid unintended pregnancy. 25 (c) Contraceptives are highly cost-effective, yielding 26 from \$4 to \$14 dollars in savings for every dollar expended. 27 (d) By reducing rates of unintended pregnancy, 28 contraceptives help reduce the need for abortions. 29 (e) Unintended pregnancies lead to higher rates of 30 infant mortality, low birth weight, and maternal morbidity and 31 threaten the economic viability of families. 1 File original & 9 copies hbd0005 04/30/99 08:08 am

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Most women in this state of childbearing age rely 1 (f) 2 on private employment-related insurance to cover their medical 3 expenses. 4 (g) Most private insurers cover prescription drugs, 5 but many exclude coverage for prescription contraceptives. The lack of contraceptive coverage in health 6 (h) 7 insurance policies places many effective forms of 8 contraceptives beyond the financial reach of many women, 9 leading to unintended pregnancies. 10 (2) Therefore, the Legislature determines that 11 enactment of this bill constitutes an important state 12 interest. 13 Section 3.
