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13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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15	Section 1. Section 231.6015, Florida Statutes, is
16	created to read:

18	provide the school districts and teachers of the state with an
19	opportunity to develop systematic, ongoing inservice training
20	programs, to assure the dissemination and application of
21	educational research developments to classroom instruction,
22	and to develop new curricula and curricular materials
23	specifically designed to meet the educational needs of the
24	students served, the Commissioner of Education shall, from
25	funds appropriated for this purpose and subject to the
26	procedures established in this section, provide funds to
27	school boards to plan, establish, and operate teacher training
28	centers.
29	(1) As used in this section, the term:
30	(a) "Teacher training center" means any site
31	established by a school board, or consortium of school boards,
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pursuant to this section to provide professional support 1 2 services to teachers within the state in order to: 1. Assist teachers in diagnosing learning needs, 3 4 experimenting with the use of multiple instructional 5 approaches, assessing student outcomes, assessing staff б development needs and plans, and training other school 7 personnel in effective pedagogical approaches. 8 2. Provide demonstration and training sites where 9 instructional personnel are trained specifically in the use of 10 computers as teaching aides and as delivery systems. 3. Develop and produce curricula and curricular 11 12 material designed to meet the educational needs of the 13 students being served through the application of educational 14 research, and new or improved teaching methods, practices, and 15 techniques. 16 4. Provide training to enable teachers improve skills 17 in order to meet the educational needs of the pupils they 18 serve. 19 5. Provide a location for collaboration and the 20 sharing of resources, ideas, methods, and approaches related to classroom instruction and management. 21 6. Retrain teachers and other education personnel to 22 become better qualified to teach in rapidly evolving, high 23 24 technology disciplines including mathematics, science, and 25 computer technology. 26 (b) "Site" means the location or locations where the 27 curriculum development and training activities of the teacher 28 training center take place. 29 (2) Pursuant to this section and State Board of Education rule, any school board, or consortium of school 30 boards, requesting funds for the planning, establishment, or 31

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operation of a teacher training center shall apply to the 1 2 Commissioner of Education. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules which establish criteria and standards by which 3 4 each application shall be evaluated which must include the 5 following: б (a) Compliance with requirements set forth in law. 7 (b) The extent of participation by the teacher 8 training center board in the preparation of the application. 9 (c) The existence of formally established policies to guide the work of the board in an effective and efficient 10 manner. 11 12 (d) The extent to which activities fulfill the 13 purposes set forth in this section. 14 (e) The strength of linkages with institutions of 15 higher education and with other cultural and educational institutions which provide learning technology inservice 16 17 training. (f) The adequacy of the resources and facilities to 18 19 carry out the proposed activities. 20 (g) Whether the proposed cost is reasonable in 21 relation to expected outcomes. 22 23 The commissioner shall review each application and recommend 24 to the state board the approval of those centers meeting the 25 requirements of this section; however, the regional 26 distribution of sites may be considered as a factor in 27 recommendation for approval. Based on the recommendations of 28 the commissioner, the state board shall approve the establishment of teacher training centers. The state board 29 must notify the applicant of reasons for denial of an 30 application. A school district may submit a revised 31

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application for further consideration by the commissioner and 1 2 the state board. (3) The State Board of Education shall provide funding 3 4 for the planning establishment, or operation of a teacher 5 training center to each school board, or consortium of school 6 boards, whose application is approved according to subsection 7 (2), to the extent specifically provided annually by the 8 Legislature in the General Appropriations Act. 9 (4) Each teacher training center shall be operated by a board of directors, the powers and duties of which shall 10 include conducting training needs assessments; formulating 11 12 policy; employing a center director and staff or consultants; 13 conducting training activities including workshops, seminars, 14 and teacher "exchanges"; developing a budget and controlling the expenditure of funds; making recommendations for 15 16 subcontracting to secure technical and other kinds of 17 assistance; and managing and supervising the activities of the teacher training center. Each board must include: 18 19 (a) A majority of members who are elementary and 20 secondary school teachers representative of teachers served by 21 the training center. 22 (b) Individuals designated by the school board. (c) At least one individual designated by the 23 24 institutions of higher education located in the area served by 25 the center. 26 (d) At least one parent of an elementary or secondary 27 pupil. 28 (e) At least one representative of a business or 29 industry. 30 31

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The board of directors shall elect a chairperson from its membership by majority vote. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules (5) necessary to implement the provisions of this section. (6) By January 1, annually, the board of directors of each teacher training center shall submit to the Commissioner of Education a report which includes a summary of the activities of the teacher training center and an evaluation of the effectiveness of these activities in providing high-quality, cost-effective inservice professional development. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. HOUSE SUMMARY Creates provisions relating to the establishment of teacher training centers. Defines terms. Establishes procedures for center approval and funding. Requires each center to be operated by a board of directors. Provides membership requirements and duties. Requires the adoption of rules. Requires an annual report. 

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
