1 (b) A middle school with a student population of not 2 more than 900 students. 3 (c) A high school with a student population of not 4 more than 1,200 students. 5 (d) A school serving kindergarten through grade 8 with a student population of not more than 700 students. 6 7 (e) A school serving kindergarten through grade 12 8 with a student population of not more than 900 students. 9 A school on a single campus which operates on a school within 10 a school concept shall be considered a small school if each 11 12 subunit physically located on the single campus meets the 13 requirements of this subsection. 14 (3) REQUIREMENTS.--15 (a) Beginning July 1, 2000, all plans for new 16 educational facilities to be constructed within a school district and reflected in the 5-year school district 17 facilities work plan shall be plans for small schools in order 18 to promote increased learning and more effective use of school 19 20 facilities. (b) Small schools shall comply with all laws, rules, 21 22 and court orders relating to racial balance.
