Any person who violates 4 the provisions of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor 5 of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or б s. 775.083. 7 (b) Organizations qualified under s. 501(c)(3) of the 8 Internal Revenue Code and registered pursuant to chapter 496, 9 or persons or organizations acting on their behalf are 10 exempted from the provisions of this subsection for activities 11 on streets or roads not maintained by the state. (c) A minor under the age of 18 years may not stand or 12 approach motor vehicles on any public street, highway, or road 13 14 in order to solicit. (d) Permits for the use of any portion of a 15 state-maintained road or right-of-way shall be required only 16 17 for those purposes and in the manner set out in s. 337.406. Failure 2 to prohibit the use of right-of-way in this manner will 3 endanger the health, safety, and general welfare of the public by causing distractions to motorists, unsafe pedestrian 4 5 movement within travel lanes, sudden stoppage or slowdown of б traffic, rapid lane changing and other dangerous traffic 7 movement, increased vehicular accidents, and motorist injuries 8 and fatalities. Such prohibited uses include, but are not 9 limited to, the free distribution or sale, or display or 10 solicitation for free distribution or sale, of any 11 merchandise, goods, property or services; the solicitation for charitable purposes; the servicing or repairing of any 12 13 vehicle, except the rendering of emergency service; the storage of vehicles being serviced or repaired on abutting 14 property or elsewhere; and the display of advertising of any 15 sort, except that any portion of a state transportation 16 17 facility may be used for an art festival, parade, fair, or other special event if permitted by the appropriate local 18 19 governmental entity. Within incorporated municipalities, the 20 local governmental entity may issue permits of limited duration for the temporary use of the right-of-way of a state 21 transportation facility for any of these prohibited uses if it 22 is determined that the use will not interfere with the safe 23 24 and efficient movement of traffic and the use will cause no 25 danger to the public. Before a road on the State Highway System may be temporarily closed for a special event, the 26 local governmental entity which permits the special event to 27 28 take place must determine that the temporary closure of the 29 road is necessary and must obtain the prior written approval for the temporary road closure from the department. Nothing in 30 31 this subsection shall be construed to authorize such

Local governmental entities may, within their respective 2 3 jurisdictions, initiate enforcement action by the appropriate 4 code enforcement authority or law enforcement authority for a 5 violation of this section. 6 (2) A minor under the age of 18 years may not stand or 7 approach motor vehicles on the right-of-way of any state 8 transportation facility, including appendages thereto, outside 9 of an incorporated municipality in order to solicit. 10 (3)(2) Persons holding valid peddlers' licenses issued 11 by appropriate governmental entities may make sales from vehicles standing on the right-of-way to occupants of abutting 12 13 property only. 14 (4) (4) (3) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 15 Vehicles and other law enforcement agencies are authorized and directed to enforce this statute. 16 17 (5) (4) The entity or organization that directs any person to violate this section shall pay a civil penalty, 18 19 which may not exceed \$500.
