Section 316.6135, Florida Statutes, is 13 amended to read: 14 316.6135 Leaving children unattended or unsupervised 15 16 in motor vehicle; penalty; authority of law enforcement officer.--17 (1) No parent, legal guardian, or other person 18 19 responsible for a child younger than 10 6 years of age shall 20 leave such child unattended or unsupervised in a motor vehicle 21 for a period in excess of 15 minutes; however, no such person 22 shall leave a child unattended for any period of time if the 23 motor of the vehicle is running or the health of the child is 24 in danger. 25 (2) No parent, legal guardian, or other person 26 responsible for a child between the ages of 10 through 15, 27 shall leave such child unattended or unsupervised in a motor 28 vehicle for a period in excess of 15 minutes; however, no such person shall leave a child unattended for any period of time 29 30 if the motor vehicle is running or the health of the child is 31 in danger.
