Information about patients of a home 20 medical equipment provider which is received by persons 21 employed by, or providing services to, a home medical 22 equipment provider or which is received by the licensing agency through reports or inspection, is confidential and 23 exempt from the provisions of section 119.07(1), Florida 24 25 Statutes, and Section 24(a), Article I of the State 26 Constitution. This section is subject to the Open Government 27 Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with section 119.15, 28 Florida Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2004, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by 29 30 the Legislature.

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1 Section 2. The Legislature finds that exempting information related to patients of home medical equipment 2 3 providers from the public records law requirements is a public necessity in that the harm caused by the release of such 4 5 personal and sensitive information, which usually includes 6 medical information, outweighs any public benefit derived from 7 releasing such information. 8 Section 3. Information that is obtained by the Agency 9 for Health Care Administration or by a home medical equipment provider in connection with background screening requirements 10 11 that apply to a prospective employee of a home medical equipment provider is confidential and exempt from the 12 provisions of section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and Section 13 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. This section is 14 subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in 15 accordance with section 119.15, Florida Statutes, and shall 16 stand repealed on October 2, 2004, unless reviewed and saved 17 from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 18 Section 4. The Legislature finds that exempting 19 background screening information related to employees of home 20 21 medical equipment providers from the public records law 22 requirements is a public necessity in that the health and safety of the public necessitates having available applicants 23 24 for positions as home medical equipment provider personnel, and allowing such information concerning applicants to be 25 26 disseminated would have a chilling effect upon the willingness 27 to apply for such positions on the part of any person about whom there is information of past misbehavior contained in 28 29 juvenile records or criminal records or in the central abuse

registry, even if the person were fully rehabilitated and

would be a suitable employee.

Section 5. This act shall take effect on the same date that Senate Bill 276 or similar legislation providing for the licensure of home medical equipment providers takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof.
