29	"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of
30	America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation
31	under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all,"
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shall be rendered by students standing with the right hand 1 over the heart. The pledge of allegiance to the flag, as 2 stated herein, shall be recited at the beginning of the day in 3 4 each elementary and secondary public school in the state, 5 provided that, upon written request by a parent or guardian, a student may be excused from reciting the pledge. When the 6 7 pledge is given, civilians must show full respect to the flag 8 by standing at attention, men removing the headdress, as provided by s. 7 of U.S... Pub. L. No. 623, approved June 22, 9 10 1942, as amended by U.S... Pub. L. No. 829, approved December 11 22, 1942. 12 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 256.11, Florida 13 Statutes, is amended to read: 14 256.11 Public auditoriums; display of the United 15 States flag. --(2) It is the duty of the person responsible for the 16 17 administration of such auditorium to provide a suitable flag and cause it to be displayed in the manner provided in 18 19 subsection (1). If any such person willfully causes fails to 20 cause the flag to fail to be so displayed, except for the cleaning, repair, or replacement of such flag, such person is 21 22 guilty of a noncriminal violation, punishable as provided in 23 s. 775.083. 24 Section 3. Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section 25 233.061, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 26 27 233.061 Required instruction.--(2) Members of the instructional staff of the public 28 29 schools, subject to the rules and regulations of the commissioner, the state board, and the school board, shall 30 31 teach efficiently and faithfully, using the books and 2

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materials required, following the prescribed courses of study, 1 2 and employing approved methods of instruction, the following: 3 (g) The history of African Americans, including the 4 history of African culture prior to the European 5 implementation <del>peoples before the political conflicts that led</del> 6 to the development of slavery, the passage to America, the 7 dehumanizing effects of the enslavement experience, abolition, 8 and the unique contributions of African Americans to society. Curriculum relating to the history of African Americans must 9 10 be designed to lead to an investigation of human behavior, the negative consequences resulting from racial hatred, encourage 11 tolerance of different races and cultures, and to promote 12 13 racial equity and pride. Section 4. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 14 15 233.09, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 233.09 Duties of each state instructional materials 16 17 committee.--The duties of each state instructional materials committee shall be: 18 (4) EVALUATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS.--TO 19 20 evaluate carefully all instructional materials submitted, to ascertain which instructional materials, if any, submitted for 21 22 consideration best implement the selection criteria developed by the Commissioner of Education and those curricular 23 24 objectives included within applicable performance standards provided for in s. 229.565. 25 (d) When recommending instructional materials for use 26 27 in the schools, each committee shall require, when appropriate to the comprehension of pupils, that materials for social 28 29 science, history, or civics classes contain the Declaration of 30 Independence and the Constitution of the United States. 31 Effective July 1, 2002 and thereafter, instructional materials 3 File original & 9 copies 04/12/99

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recommended for adoption for subjects including, but not 1 2 limited to, science, math, history, and health must include 3 historical data related to the contributions of African 4 Americans, Hispanics, and women. No instructional materials 5 shall be recommended by any committee for use in the schools which contain any matter reflecting unfairly upon persons б 7 because of their race, color, creed, national origin, 8 ancestry, gender, or occupation. Section 5. Subsection (2) of section 233.34, Florida 9 10 Statutes, is amended to read: 11 233.34 Use of instructional materials allocation; 12 instructional materials, library books, and reference books; 13 repair of books. --(2) Each school district shall use the annual 14 15 allocation for the purchase of instructional materials included on the state-adopted list. No less than 50 percent 16 17 of the annual allocation shall be used to purchase items which will be used to provide instruction to students at the level 18 or levels for which the materials are designed. However, up 19 20 to 50 percent of the annual allocation may be used for the purchase of instructional materials, including library and 21 reference books and nonprint materials, not included on the 22 state-adopted list and for the repair and renovation of 23 24 textbooks and library books. However, such funds may not be used for the purchase of instructional materials for subjects 25 including, but not limited to, science, math, history, and 26 27 health which do not include historical data related to the contributions of African Americans, Hispanics, and women. 28 Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, school 29 30 districts may use 100 percent of that portion of the annual 31 allocation which is designated by the district for the

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purchase of instructional materials for kindergarten, and 75 1 2 percent of that portion of the annual allocation which is 3 designated for the purchase of instructional materials for 4 first grade, to purchase materials not on the state-adopted 5 list. 6 7 ============ ТТТГ.
