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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 400.462, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

400.462 Definitions.--As used in this part, the term:

- (1) "Certified nursing assistant" means any person who has been issued a certificate after fulfilling the requirements of s. 400.211.
- "Companion" or "sitter" means a person who cares for an elderly, handicapped, or convalescent individual and accompanies such individual on trips and outings and may prepare and serve meals to such individual.
- (3) "Department" means the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services.
- "Home health agency" means an organization that provides home health services and staffing services for health care facilities.
- (5) "Home health agency personnel" means persons who are employed by or under contract with a home health agency and enter the home or place of residence of patients at any 31 time in the course of their employment or contract.

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"Home health aide" means a person who has (6) accomplished training required by the Agency for Health Care Administration and is authorized to provide hands-on care, including assisting the patient in the activities of daily living, such as dressing, grooming, bathing, eating, and personal hygiene, and assisting with physical transfer, ambulation, and self-administered medications.

(7) "Home health services" means health and medical services and medical supplies furnished to an individual by home health agency personnel or by others under arrangements with the agency, on a visiting basis, in the individual's home or place of residence. The term includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- (a) Nursing care.
- (b) Physical, occupational, respiratory, or speech therapy.
  - (c) Home health aide services.
  - (d) Nutritional quidance.
- (e) Medical supplies, restricted to drugs and biologicals prescribed by a physician.
- (8) "Homemaker" means a person who performs household chores that include housekeeping, meal planning and preparation, shopping assistance, and routine household activities for an elderly, handicapped, or convalescent individual.
- (9) "Nurse registry" means any person that procures, offers, promises, or attempts to secure health-care-related contracts for registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, certified nursing assistants, home health aides, sitters, companions, or homemakers, who are compensated 31 by fees as independent contractors, including, but not limited

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to, contracts for the provision of services to patients and contracts to provide private duty or staffing services to health care facilities licensed under chapter 395 or this chapter.

(10)<del>(9)</del> "Patient" means any person who receives home health services in his or her home or place of residence.

(11)<del>(10)</del> "Screening" means the assessment of the background of home health agency personnel, nurse registry personnel, and persons registered under s. 400.509 and includes employment history checks, records checks of the department's central abuse hotline under chapter 415 relating to vulnerable adults, and statewide criminal records correspondence checks through the Department of Law Enforcement.

(12)<del>(11)</del> "Staffing services" means services provided to a health care facility on a temporary basis by licensed health care personnel, including certified nursing assistants.

Section 2. Subsection (10) of section 400.506, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read:

400.506 Licensure of nurse registries; requirements; penalties.--

- (10)(a) A nurse registry may refer for contract in private residences registered nurses and licensed practical nurses registered and licensed under chapter 464, certified nursing assistants certified under s. 400.211, home health aides, and sitters, companions, or homemakers for the purposes of providing those services authorized under s. 400.509(1).
- (b) A certified nursing assistant or home health aide may be referred for a contract to provide care to a patient in his or her home only if that patient is under a physician's 31 care. A certified nursing assistant referred for contract in

 a private residence shall be limited to assisting a patient with bathing, dressing, toileting, grooming, eating, physical transfer, and those normal daily routines the patient could perform for himself or herself were he or she physically capable. A certified nursing assistant may not provide medical or other health care services that require specialized training and that may be performed only by licensed health care professionals. The nurse registry shall obtain the name and address of the attending physician and send written notification to the physician within 48 hours after a contract is concluded that a certified nursing assistant will be providing care for that patient.

(c) A registered nurse shall make monthly visits to the patient's home to assess the patient's condition and the quality of care being provided by the certified nursing assistant or home health aide. Any condition that which in the professional judgment of the nurse requires further medical attention shall be reported to the attending physician and the nurse registry. The assessment shall become a part of the patient's file with the nurse registry and may be reviewed by the Agency for Health Care Administration during their survey procedure.

(d) In order to refer for contract in private residences a certified nursing assistant or any person specified in s. 400.509(1), the nurse registry and such person registered with the nurse registry must also be registered under s. 400.509. Any person registered as an independent contractor with a nurse registry for the purpose of providing services authorized under s. 400.509(1) on or before October 1, 1990, is exempt from registration under s. 400.509 so long

as such person remains continuously registered with that nurse registry. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. SENATE SUMMARY Defines the term "home health aide" and provides for such persons to be referred for contract by nurse registries. Deletes a dual-registration requirement.
