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25	Section 1. Section 744.3146, Florida Statutes, is

28	(1) A professional guardian as defined in s.
29	744.102(15) shall register with the Statewide Public
30	<u>Guardianship Office.</u>

1 (2) Each registrant shall submit to and pay for any investigation, history, and background screening required by 2 3 any rules adopted by the Statewide Public Guardianship Office. (3) Registration must be made and renewed under oath 4 5 on forms furnished by the Statewide Public Guardianship Office б and must be accompanied by the appropriate registration fee as 7 set by the Statewide Public Guardianship Office. The fee must 8 be sufficient to pay for the administrative costs of registering the professional guardian and furthering the 9 purposes of this section. The Statewide Public Guardianship 10 11 Office shall provide copies of the registration to the court, without charge, upon request. The Statewide Public 12 Guardianship Office may also charge reasonable fees, 13 reflecting actual costs, to other persons requesting copies of 14 the certificate of registration. 15 Registration must include the following: 16 (4) The name, address, date of birth, and employer 17 (a) identification number of the professional guardian. 18 19 (b) If the registrant is a firm or partnership, the name, address, and date of birth of every member, and the 20 employer identification number of the firm or partnership. 21 22 If the registrant is a corporation or association, (C) its name, address, and employer identification number; the 23 name, address, and date of birth of each of its directors and 24 officers; and the name, address, and date of birth of each 25 26 person having at least a 10 percent interest in the 27 corporation or association. (d) The name, address, date of birth, and employer 28 29 identification number, if applicable, of each person employed 30 or under contract with the professional guardian who is involved in guardianship functions. 31

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1 (5) Upon verification that all requirements for registration have been met, the Statewide Public Guardianship 2 3 Office must issue a certificate of registration valid for a term to be set by the office. 4 5 The Statewide Public Guardianship Office shall (6) б deny, suspend, or revoke the certificate of registration of a 7 person who: 8 (a) Fails to comply with this section. 9 (b) Is removed or disqualified from service as a 10 guardian for reasons set forth in s. 744.474(1)-(16) and s. 11 744.474(18). 12 (7) A professional guardian who offers or advertises services to the public must include in its advertisement the 13 certificate of registration number issued by the Statewide 14 Public Guardianship Office. 15 It is unlawful to advertise services or to hold an 16 (8) 17 appointment as a professional guardian without first obtaining a certificate of registration from the Statewide Public 18 19 Guardianship Office. Any person who violates this subsection is subject to suspension of registration and removal as 20 21 guardian in all cases in which the person serves. 22 An authorized employee of the Statewide Public (9) 23 Guardianship Office may make inspections and investigations 24 necessary to respond to complaints or to determine compliance with this section. The Statewide Public Guardianship Office 25 employee may contact the abuse registry, law enforcement 26 27 agencies, and the courts with regard to Statewide Public Guardianship Office inspections or investigative findings. 28 29 (10) The Statewide Public Guardianship Office has 30 authority to adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this 31 section.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000. SENATE SUMMARY Requires professional guardians to register with the Statewide Public Guardianship Office. Provides for investigation and background screening. Provides procedures. Provides a registration fee. Prescribes information to be included in the registration. Provides for issuance of a certificate of registration. Provides for the denial, suspension, or revocation of a certificate of registration. Requires that the certificate of registration number be included in any advertisement of guardianship services. Provides that it is unlawful to hold an appointment as a professional guardian without first obtaining a certificate of registration. Provides a penalty. Authorizes employees of the office to make inspections and investigations. Provides the office with rulemaking authority. б 

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
