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# I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Administrative Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Administrative Trust Fund, FLAIR #65-2-021, is administered by the Department of Elder Affairs. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-97, Laws of Florida.

# II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Sections 400.619 and 400.6196, F.S., provide sources of revenue for the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used to offset the expenses of departmental training and education for adult family-care home providers.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are licensure application and renewal fees and administrative fines. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$728,241.00.

## B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.

## III. FISCAL ANALYSIS & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:

	This legislation has no fiscal impact on state agencies or state funds, on local governments as a whole or on the private sector. It simply re-creates, without modification, an existing state trust fund and continues the current use of the fund.
