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I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Cultural Institutions Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Cultural Institutions Trust Fund, FLAIR #45-2-478, is administered by the Department of State. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-49, Laws of Florida.

The House substituted SB 626 for HB 1403 prior to final passage on March 15, 2000.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 265.2681, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides revenue sources for the fund, and defines the uses of the fund.

Section 607.1901. F.S., provides a revenue source for the fund. Sections 265.608 and 265.609, F.S., define uses for the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used for the funding of statewide arts grants, arts in education and visiting arts programs, the State Touring Program, local arts agencies and state service organizations, and state-owned cultural facilities with the primary purpose of the presentation of fine arts or performing arts.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are transfers from the Corporations Trust Fund. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$18,233,328,43.

	This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
