Amendment No. 1 (for drafter's use only) CHAMBER ACTION Senate House 1 2 3 4 5 ORIGINAL STAMP BELOW 6 7 8 9 10 The Committee on Financial Services offered the following: 11 12 13 Amendment (with title amendment) On page 3, line 22, - page 4, line 20 14 remove from the bill: all said lines 15 16 17 and insert in lieu thereof: (1) The Office of Drug Control within the Executive 18 19 Office of the Governor, in consultation with the Florida 20 Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Council, and in conjunction with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement 21 22 and local law enforcement agencies having primary authority over the affected seaports, shall develop, by January 1, 2001, 23 a statewide seaport security plan. 24 25 (2) All seaports as identified pursuant to s. 311.09(1), in conjunction with and pending review and approval 26 by the Office of Drug Control, within the Executive Office of 27 28 the Governor, and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, 29 and in consultation with the Florida Seaport Transportation 30 and Economic Development Council, shall, no later than January 31 31, 2001, develop and draft individual seaport security plans 1

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particular to the specific and identifiable needs of their 1 2 respective seaports. 3 Each seaport security plan shall adhere to uniform (a) 4 statewide minimum security standards for the prevention of criminal activity to include money laundering and shall 5 6 incorporate the security recommendations of the Florida 7 Seaport Security Assessment 2000, that shall be met by any 8 seaport listed in s. 311.09(1). (b) All such seaports shall allow unimpeded access to 9 10 the affected ports for purposes of inspections by the 11 Department of Law Enforcement as authorized by this section. 12 (3) A fingerprint-based criminal history check shall 13 be performed on any applicant for employment or current 14 employee, as designated by the security plan authorized by 15 this section, who will be working within the property of or have regular access to any seaport listed in s. 311.09(1). The 16 17 costs of such checks shall be paid by the seaport or employing 18 entity or any person so checked. The applicant or employee shall file a complete set of fingerprints taken in a manner 19 required by the Department of Law Enforcement and the security 20 plan. These fingerprints shall be submitted to the Department 21 22 of Law Enforcement for state processing and to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for federal processing. The results of 23 24 the checks shall be reported to the seaports in a manner 25 established by the security plan authorized by this section. The affected seaports shall implement the security 26 (4) 27 standards developed under this section by December 31, 2001. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement, or any entity 28 29 selected by the Department, shall conduct no less than once 30 annually an unannounced inspection of each seaport listed in 31 s. 311.09(1) to determine whether the seaport is meeting the 2

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minimum standards established under the authority of this 1 section. The Department of Law Enforcement, in consultation 2 3 with the Office of Drug Control within the Executive Office of 4 the Governor, must complete a report indicating the results of all such inspections conducted during the year and any 5 suggestions or concerns developed by reason of such 6 7 inspections by no later than December 31 of each year. A copy 8 of the report shall be provided to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and the chief 9 10 administrator of each seaport inspected. The report shall, to the extent possible, include responses from the chief 11 12 administrator of any seaport about which suggestions have been 13 made or security concerns raised, indicating what actions, if any, have been taken or are planned to be taken in response to 14 15 the suggestions or concerns noted.
