The "practice of 13 14 osteopathic medicine" does not include coverage decisions for purposes of insurance benefits as long as medical judgments 15 are not involved. 16 17 Section 3. Subsection (11) of section 641.495, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 18 19 641.495 Requirements for issuance and maintenance of 20 certificate.--(11) The organization shall designate a medical 21 director who is a physician licensed under chapter 458 or 22 chapter 459. For every adverse determination made by the 23 24 organization regarding any subscriber, the medical director is required to document and sign the subscriber's medical records 25 setting forth the facts regarding the organization's adverse 26 27 determination and the rationale for such decision. The 28 rendering of an adverse determination by an organization shall 29 constitute the practice of medicine, as defined in s. 458.305, 30 by the medical director of the organization. 31 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.
