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27	The committee substitute restricts licensure by endorsement of applicants who have taken the required licensure examination
28	no more than 15 years before their application. The bill revises the requirements for the Board of Pharmacy and the
29	Department of Health to impose restrictions on a license by endorsement for any act committed in another jurisdiction that
30	would constitute a violation of chapter 465. F.S.
