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 24 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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 26           Section 1. Subsection (13) of section 766.106, Florida  
 27 Statutes, is repealed.

28           Section 2. Section 768.151, Florida Statutes, is  
 29 repealed.

30           Section 3. Section 768.27, Florida Statutes, is  
 31 repealed.

1           Section 4.   Section 768.30, Florida Statutes, is  
2 repealed.

3           Section 5.   Section 960.296, Florida Statutes, is  
4 repealed.

5           Section 6.  This act shall take effect upon becoming a  
6 law.

10           Repeals various statutory provisions that have become

13 Repeals or deletes provisions relating to applicability  
14 of provisions establishing presuit requirements for  
15 medical malpractice claims; temporary revival of waiver  
16 of sovereign immunity authorized under ch. 69-116, Laws  
17 of Florida, for certain causes of action; the effective  
18 date and applicability of the Florida Wrongful Death Act;  
19 the effective dates and applicability of provisions  
20 governing waiver of sovereign immunity in tort actions;  
21 and construction and severability of provisions governing
