29	(c) "Biological agent" means any microorganism, virus,				
30	infectious substance, or biological product that may be				
31	engineered through biotechnology, or any naturally occurring

Deleterious alteration of the environment. 9 "Toxin" means the toxic material of plants, (d) animals, microorganisms, viruses, fungi, or infectious 10 11 substances, or a recombinant molecule, whatever its origin or method of reproduction, including: 12 1. Any poisonous substance or biological product that 13 may be engineered through biotechnology produced by a living 14 15 organism; or Any poisonous isomer or biological product, 16 2. homolog, or derivative of such substance. 17 (e) "Delivery system" means: 18 19 1. Any apparatus, equipment, device, or means of delivery specifically designed to deliver or disseminate a 20 21 biological agent, toxin, or vector; or 22 2. Any vector. "Vector" means a living organism or molecule, 23 (f) including a recombinant molecule or biological product that 24 25 may be engineered through biotechnology, capable of carrying a 26 biological agent or toxin to a host. 27 "Destructive device" shall have the same meaning (q) 28 as that term is defined in s. 790.001(4). 29 (2) A person who, without lawful authority, 30 manufactures, possesses, sells, delivers, displays, uses, threatens to use, attempts to use, or conspires to use, or who 31 3

LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY Prohibits the unlawful manufacture, possession, sale, delivery, display, use, or attempted or threatened use of a "weapon of mass destruction" or a "hoax weapon of mass destruction," as defined by the act. Prohibits unlawful conspiring to use such weapons and making such weapons readily accessible to others. Provides a first degree felony penalty for violation with respect to a weapon of mass destruction and provides that violation which results in death is a capital felony. Provides a second degree felony penalty for violation. Ranks the offenses for purposes of sentencing under the Criminal Punishment purposes of sentencing under the Criminal Punishment Code.
