A bill to be entitled An act relating to weapons of mass destruction; creating s. 790.166, F.S.; prohibiting the unlawful manufacture, possession, sale, delivery, display, use, or attempted or threatened use of a weapon of mass destruction; prohibiting unlawful conspiring to use such weapon; prohibiting making such weapon readily accessible to others; providing a first degree felony penalty for violation; providing that violation which results in death is a capital felony; prohibiting the unlawful manufacture, possession, sale, delivery, display, use, or attempted or threatened use of a hoax weapon of mass destruction; prohibiting unlawful conspiring to use such weapon; prohibiting making such weapon readily accessible to others; providing a second degree felony penalty for violation; providing definitions for purposes of the act; providing nonapplicability of the act; amending s. 921.0022, F.S., relating to the Criminal Punishment Code; providing for ranking the offense of possessing, selling, or using a weapon of mass destruction and the offense of possessing, selling, or using a hoax weapon of mass destruction; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 790.166, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

790.166 Manufacture, possession, sale, delivery, display, use, or attempted or threatened use of a weapon of mass destruction or hoax weapon of mass destruction prohibited; definitions; penalties.--

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Weapon of mass destruction" means:
- 1. Any device or object that is designed or intended to cause death or serious bodily injury through the release, dissemination, or impact of toxic or poisonous chemicals, or their precursors;
- 2. Any device or object involving a disease organism; or
- 3. Any device or object that is designed to release radiation or radioactivity at a level dangerous to human life.
- (b) "Hoax weapon of mass destruction" means any device or object that by its design, construction, content, or characteristics appears to be or to contain, or is represented to be, constitute, or contain, a weapon of mass destruction as defined in this section, but which is, in fact, an inoperative facsimile, imitation, counterfeit, or representation of a weapon of mass destruction which does not meet the definition of a weapon of mass destruction or which does not actually contain or constitute a weapon, biological agent, toxin, vector, or delivery system prohibited by this section.
- (c) "Biological agent" means any microorganism, virus, infectious substance, or biological product that may be engineered through biotechnology, or any naturally occurring or bioengineered component of any such microorganism, virus,

3	1. Death, disease, or other biological malfunction in

26 27 commits a felony of the first degree, punishable by imprisonment for a term of years not exceeding life or as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084, and if death results, commits a capital felony, punishable as provided in s. 775.082.

- (3) Any person who, without lawful authority, manufactures, possesses, sells, delivers, displays, uses, threatens to use, attempts to use, or conspires to use, or who makes readily accessible to others, a hoax weapon of mass destruction with the intent to deceive or otherwise mislead another person into believing that the hoax weapon of mass destruction will cause terror, bodily harm, or property damage commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- This section does not apply to any member or employee of the Armed Forces of the United States, a federal or state governmental agency, or a private entity who is otherwise engaged in lawful activity within the scope of his or her employment, if such person is otherwise duly authorized or licensed to manufacture, possess, sell, deliver, display, or otherwise engage in activity relative to this section and if such person is in compliance with applicable federal and state law.

2		COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1840

4	-	Deletes the term "destructive devise" from the definition of a weapon of mass destruction since current
5		law already provides penalties for possession or use of a destructive device. Other references to destructive
6		device are also deleted.
7	-	Deletes provision excluding chemical weapons from weapon of mass destruction offense to clarify that use or
8		possession of chemical weapons do come within scope of newly created offense.
9	-	Deletes provisions requiring that the weapons of mass
10 11		destruction offense must be committed "against" any person in the state or "against" any state property since these elements do not relate well with the
12		manufacture, possess, sell, deliver, or display elements.
13	_	Adds intent element to the hoax weapon of mass
14		destruction offense to clarify that use of hoax must be with the intent to deceive or otherwise mislead another
15		person into believing that the hoax weapon will cause terror, bodily harm, or property damage.
16	-	Adds the designation "PBL" in the Offense Severity Ranking Chart for the new created first degree felony
