Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 39.201, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

39.201 Mandatory reports of child abuse, abandonment, or neglect; mandatory reports of death; central abuse hotline.--

(2)(a) Each report of known or suspected child abuse, abandonment, or neglect pursuant to this section, except those solely under s. 827.04(4) s. 827.04(3), shall be made immediately to the department's central abuse hotline on the single statewide toll-free telephone number, and, if the report is of an instance of known or suspected child abuse by a noncaretaker, the call shall be immediately electronically transferred to the appropriate county sheriff's office by the central abuse hotline. If the report is of an instance of known or suspected child abuse involving impregnation of a child under 16 years of age by a person 21 years of age or older solely under s. 827.04(4)s. 827.04(3), the report shall be made immediately to the appropriate county sheriff's office or other appropriate law enforcement agency. If the report is of an instance of known or suspected child abuse solely under s. 827.04(4) s. 827.04(3), the reporting provisions of this subsection do not apply to health care professionals or other persons who provide medical or counseling services to pregnant children when such reporting would interfere with the provision of medical services.

Section 4. Section 90.4025, Florida Statutes, is

amended to read:

90.4025 Admissibility of paternity determination in certain criminal prosecutions.—If a person less than 18 years of age gives birth to a child and the paternity of that child is established under chapter 742, such evidence of paternity is admissible in a criminal prosecution under ss. 794.011, 794.05, 800.04, and  $827.04(4)\frac{827.04(3)}{100}$ .

Section 5. Section 382.356, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

382.356 Protocol for sharing certain birth certificate information.—In order to facilitate the prosecution of offenses under s. 794.011, s. 794.05, s. 800.04, or  $\underline{s}$ .  $\underline{827.04(4)}$ s.  $\underline{827.04(3)}$ , the Department of Health, the Department of Revenue, and the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association shall develop a protocol for sharing birth certificate information for all children born to unmarried mothers who are less than 17 years of age at the time of the child's birth.

Section 6. Subsection (4) of section 742.107, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

742.107 Determining paternity of child with mother under 16 years of age when impregnated.--

(4) When the information provided by the applicant or recipient who was impregnated while under age 16 indicates that such person is the victim of child abuse as provided in  $\underline{s.\ 827.04(4)}\underline{s.\ 827.04(3)}$ , the Department of Revenue or the Department of Children and Family Services shall notify the county sheriff's office or other appropriate agency or official and provide information needed to protect the child's health or welfare.
